

ITINERARY

MON MAY 22 DEPART USA

TUE MAY 23 ARRIVE HONFLEUR, FRANCE

Upon arrival at Charles de Gaulle Airport we will proceed through the VIP Meet & Assist Fast Track service, and then transfer by private car to **Honfleur** in Normandy where we will spend 2 nights at the lovely LA FERME SAINT SIMEON.

Honfleur looks so utterly enchanting, it is hard to remember that it was built essentially for commerce. Its harbour sits in a great location, tucked away on the southern side of the Seine's estuary. Honfleur's beauty has long attracted artists, with works to be seen both in the town museums and in the modern galleries that abound. Along Honfleur's stretch of estuary, you can stroll through civic gardens to the beach. Up the hillside, visit Notre-Dame de Grâce chapel and enjoy great views over the Seine estuary.

Overnight at LA FERME SAINT SIMÉON: Once a refuge for impressionist painters, La Ferme Saint-Siméon is celebrated for its bucolic surroundings and beautiful Seine estuary light. Monet and Courbet would come here and work on their colours, and Baudelaire would flee the melancholy of Paris in search of inspiration. The farm, close to the old harbour of Honfleur and the Eugène-Boudin Museum, has now been restored throughout and provides an outstanding spa with beauty and relaxing treatments based on organic ingredients such as milk and Normandy apples. "Oh, Saint-Siméon", exclaimed the painter Eugène Boudin in one of his journals. Indeed it is hard not to love the place, and even harder to leave it behind.

WED MAY 24 NORMANDY LANDING BEACHES

Meals: B, L, D

Today, we have a full day visiting the **Landing Beaches** of World War II fame.

Overnight at LA FERME SAINT SIMEON

THU MAY 25 HONFLEUR

Meals: B, D

Embarkation from 4:00pm – 5:00pm / Departure at 6:00pm

A treasure of the **Côte Fleurie**, Honfleur is located on the edge of la Crique de Rouen in Normandy. You will no doubt admire the historical ships moored in its **old port**. With its tall, slate-covered houses, the quays provide a great setting for a very nice walk. In the streets behind the harbor, you will see many timber houses. These picturesque places were the cradle of several pre-impressionist painters. You can see their works in the **Eugène Boudin museum**. Exhibited works represent scenes of medieval streets and the coastline as it used to be, as illustrated by the Butin beach and its lush green hillsides. This afternoon we board **Le Boreal** and set sail.

FRI MAY 26 ISLES OF SCILLY

Meals: B, L, D

Arrival at 1:30pm / Departure at 7:00pm

Just off the **Cornish** peninsula, flung out in the Celtic sea, the **Isles of Scilly**, are composed of a multitude of small islands, of which only five are inhabited. Thanks to the **Gulf Stream**, this granite archipelago enjoys a milder climate than on the mainland, making it a real subtropical paradise for vegetation. The 7 hectares of vegetation in the luxuriant **Tresco** gardens are worth the detour. In St Mary's, the largest island of the archipelago, a walk on the coastal paths offer landscapes that leave nothing to desire, not even the beaches of the Caribbean. **Meals: B, L, D**

SAT MAY 27 CORK (COBH)

Meals: B, L, D

Arrival at 8:00am / Departure at 6:00pm

This charming stopover on the southern coast of Ireland will certainly win you over with its **pastel-shaded houses** layered up the hillside. A little train relieves you from having to climb the steep streets of the historic centre. Once you're there, you come to **Saint Colman cathedral** overlooking the coastline. The extensive panorama provides views of the little islands in Cork Harbor. Down below, the **pubs complete with their floral window displays** are enough to catch your eye. The pubs are famous for their traditional dishes like

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“colcannon” - a steaming hot soup made with cabbage served in a bowl, or a plate of boxties - crispy potato cakes with horse radish. An *optional excursion* is available to visit Blarney Castle and Kinsale for those interested.

SUN MAY 28 SAILING IN FRONT OF MOHER CLIFFS

Arrival at 11:00am / Departure at 12:00pm

SUN MAY 28 ARAN ISLANDS

Meals: B, L, D

Arrival at 2:00pm / Departure at 7:00pm

The Aran Islands are located just off Galway and Doolin. A true Irish experience awaits, locals speak Irish as well as English in a setting of Celtic churches of historical significance including **World Heritage site Dun Aonghasa** which is set on a dramatic 300 ft cliff edge.

MON MAY 29 GALWAY

Meals: B, L, D

Arrival at 7:00am / Departure at 6:30pm

Built at the mouth of the Corrib in the West, Galway is one of the loveliest towns in the country. An *optional shore excursion* affords you the opportunity to travel along the shores of Galway Bay to the picturesque town of Kinvara. We will visit **Dunguaire Castle** before continuing inland to visit the **Rathbaum Farm**, a unique 150 year old farmhouse for a little Irish farming history while enjoying homemade scones and a warm cup of tea. We return to Galway, capital of County Galway for a taste of its cobbled streets in its historical center that features designer boutiques, artists' studios, and Bohemian cafes.

TUE MAY 30 KILLYBEGS

Meals: B, L, D

Arrival at 8:00am / Departure at 7:00pm

This charming **fishing port** is located in Donegal Bay, on the northwest tip of Ireland. Among the various *optional shore excursions* that will be offered here is an opportunity to participate in a stroll through Donegal town and a visit to the Franciscan Abbey and Donegal Castle.

WED MAY 31 IONA (HEBRIDES), SCOTLAND

Meals: B, L, D

Arrival at 8:00am / Departure at 12:00pm

Of all the islands in the **Inner Hebrides**, **Iona** is by far the most conducive to contemplation and meditation. And for good reason... It is on this island, sacred ever since, that Saint Columba landed from Ireland in 563 and undertook to evangelize **Scotland**. Now an abbey, the island's true spiritual centre, stands where the ancient monastery founded by the Irish missionary once stood. Many kings of Scotland, including the legendary **Macbeth**, are believed to be buried in the nearby cemetery. In sunny weather, arriving on the Isle of Iona is a stunningly beautiful experience.

WED MAY 31 TOBERMORY

Meals: B, L, D

Arrival at 4:00pm / Departure at 8:00pm

Located at the northernmost tip of the lovely **Isle of Mull**, **Tobermory** has to be one of the most beautiful natural seaports on Scotland's West Coast. Founded in 1788, this ancient fishing village has been converted to a leisure port highly appreciated today for its surroundings and the quiet charm it exudes. You will definitely be won over by the row of many-storied houses on the hillside, illuminating the harbor with their vibrant colors. Although the real spectacle is outdoors, a visit to the interesting Mull Museum dedicated the local history and the exhibitions at the An Tobar art gallery is well worth the time.

THU JUN 01 BELFAST-NORTHERN IRELAND

Meals: B, L, D

Arrival at 8:30am / Departure at 6:00pm

The capital city of Northern Ireland is located on the very tip of Belfast Lough, in the north-east of the Emerald Isle. Along the waterfront, the building shaped like a fragmented liner is none other than the Titanic Belfast, a homage to the famous transatlantic liner, with full-scale reconstructions making for an insightful experience of the Belle Epoque. In the historical centre, you'll also travel back in time when you see the majestic Edwardian columns of the City Hall, and the imposing neo-gothic towers of Queen's University for example. The carved wooden façades of the Victorian pubs will certainly entice you in for a pint of beer or chilled cider.

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FRI JUN 02 GLASGOW / FROM THE LOWLANDS THROUGH THE GRAMPIANS Meal: B, L, D
Disembarkation 8:00am

Welcome to Scotland! After disembarkation from *Le Boreal* this morning, we will be met by our tour curator from our **Virtuoso partner in Scotland, Dream Escape**. Our tour curator will be with us for the duration of our journey around Scotland.

We will board our motor coach for the first leg of our journey that will take us across **Glasgow**, Scotland's largest city and continue northeast into the Central Lowlands.

In the heart of the **Clyde Valley**, the bustling city of **Glasgow** contrasts starkly with the wild beauty of the surrounding countryside. Scotland's most urban city overflows with landmarks from its extensive artistic heritage and outstanding architectural tradition. The city's checkerboard layout makes walking through the major pedestrian thoroughfares easy: go with the flow and let the lively street atmosphere take us past the many Victorian monuments.

Our route passes through some of the most important places in the history of Scotland. Follow the highway to **Stirling**, the town dominated by the former royal castle that has held such an important position in the history of Scotland. During our visit here, see the **Chapel Royal**, where the infant Mary was crowned Queen of Scots in 1542. Also visit the Great Hall that has been refurbished to its former glory.

The castle overlooks **Stirling Bridge** where William "**Braveheart**" Wallace defeated the English in 1297. On the other side of the valley, the River Forth is dominated by the Wallace Monument from where there is a wonderful view. To the south of the town is **Bannockburn**, where Robert the Bruce finally defeated the English in 1314, thus ending the Wars of Independence.

After lunch in a local restaurant, our driver will leave us at the train station where we board a **Scotrail train service** to the north. Sit back and relax as the train makes its way from Perth along the Tay Valley and then through the heart of the **Grampian Mountains**.

When we alight from the train, our main tour driver will transfer to our hotel in the **Inverness** area. Dinner will be taken at the hotel tonight.

Overnight at CULLODEN HOUSE HOTEL: In many acres of beautiful private grounds and gardens, the *Culloden House Hotel*, an elegant Georgian country house is an award-winning 4-star hotel. The splendid rooms are lavishly furnished, with wooden furniture and luxurious bedding. Many boast delightful features such as crystal chandeliers and marble fireplaces. With beautiful ornate plasterwork, the fine-dining restaurant offers superb cuisine made with the finest, freshest seasonal produce available locally.

SAT JUN 03 LEISURELY TOUR IN THE INVERNESS AREA Meals: B, L, D

This morning's drive is along the **Great Glen**, the wide valley that bisects the Scottish Highlands. Arrive at Scotland's most famous stretch of water, **Loch Ness** which is an impressive 23 miles in length and a mile in width. See the hugely photogenic remains of **Castle Urquhart**, perched on its rocky peninsula overlooking the waters. Dating back to the 13th century it was a critical stronghold in the highlands, however its chequered history came to a dramatic end in 1692 when it was blown up to stop it falling into Jacobite hands. We may even get a glance of the lake's elusive resident...

After lunch in a local restaurant, spend the afternoon exploring the area around **Inverness**, the "**Highland Capital**". Cross the emotive battlefield at **Culloden Moor**, the site of the infamous battle in 1746 where the Jacobite army of Bonnie Prince Charlie was defeated by government forces; here a private guided tour will show us how the battle unfolded.

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Another treat on this day will be a visit to **Leanach Farm**, where the proprietor will show us his skill in using a sheepdog to round up his flock. See how the dogs respond to his whistles and calls, effectively moving the sheep around the farm to the correct place.

This evening, our curator will escort us to a local restaurant for a taste of real Highland hospitality and cooking!

Overnight at CULLODEN HOUSE HOTEL

SUN JUN 04 SCENERY OF THE NORTHWEST HIGHLANDS AND SKYE Meals: B, L, D

Leave the *Culloden House* this morning for a long day of touring through the richest scenery in the whole of the Scottish Highlands. Cross the Kessock Bridge and drive over the **Black Isle** peninsula to Dingwall. Here the road heads west through the grandiose and barren landscapes of Easter and Wester Ross. The route takes us right over to **Loch Carron**, an inlet of the sea on the West Coast.

It is just a short distance from here to the **Skye Bridge**, a modern wonder that connects the Isle of Skye to the mainland. Hopefully the weather will permit some fine views of the **Cuillin Hills**, the majestic mountain range that dominates the heart of the island. Take a short drive to the Broadford area where lunch will be taken in a local café.

This afternoon, return over the bridge, and continue to visit **Eilean Donan Castle**, the iconic fortress on an island that has adorned many a chocolate box cover! Drive east through a striking valley called **Glen Shiel** which is overlooked by the “**Five Sisters of Kintail**”. We eventually reach Invergarry, from where we will follow the middle part of the **Great Glen** past Loch Lochy towards Fort William.

Our day ends with check in at the castle that is our home for two nights: *Inverlochy Castle*.

Overnight at INVERLOCHY CASTLE: The castle nestles comfortably in the foothills of mighty Ben Nevis. In 1873, during a trip to Balmoral, Queen Victoria spent a week here sketching and painting where she wrote in her diaries ‘I never saw a lovelier or more romantic spot’. Dining is a delight and renowned throughout the world. This is one of a handful of restaurants that have been awarded 3AA rosettes and a respected Michelin star. Sample the renowned cuisine this evening. (Note: dinner is in a formal setting, where a jacket is required for gentlemen.)

MON JUN 05 “THE ROAD TO THE ISLES” Meals: B, L, D

This morning travel the short distance to Fort William train station. Here we step on board the first class car of the “**Jacobite Express**” steam train, justifiably mentioned as one of the “world’s great train journeys”. Departing this morning, we travel over the **Glenfinnan Viaduct**, perhaps best known for featuring in the Harry Potter films. The route travels along one of the most famous and beautiful stretches of coastline, which is quite simply spectacular and will without a doubt be a highlight of the trip. On a clear day, we can see the enchanting **Small Isles of Muck, Eigg and Rum** – with Skye to be seen in the distance – breath-taking!

At Mallaig, look out over the South of Sleat to the **Isle of Skye**. Weather permitting we will hopefully see the peninsula framed in the background by the **Cuillin Hills**. This afternoon after lunch in a local restaurant, return to Fort William along the fabled “**Road to the Isles**”; pass south to the **Silver Sands of Morar**, one of Scotland’s iconic coastal sites. Return to **Fort William** by road; en route, pause at **Glenfinnan** to inspect the monument to **Bonnie Prince Charlie** from closer quarters.

This evening, our curator will escort us to a restaurant where the local fresh seafood very much features on the menu.

Overnight at INVERLOCHY CASTLE

TUE JUN 06 THROUGH GLENCOE TO GLENEAGLES Meals: B, L, D

Leave Fort William behind, and take a turning into the eerie valley of **Glencoe**; it was here that the McDonalds were massacred by the Campbells in 1692. Then cross over the bleak and windswept terrain of **Rannoch Moor**, one of the wildest places in Scotland. The route leads down to Crianlarich, near where we will stop for lunch today.

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This afternoon turn east to drive through the northern side of the **Trossachs National Park**. The area is often known as “**Rob Roy Country**”, after the notorious outlaw who held sway over this area during the 18th century.

Take time to visit **Drummond Castle Gardens**, one of Scotland’s most important formal gardens which are among the finest in Europe. A mile of beech-lined avenue leads to a formidable ridge-top tower house. Enter through the woven iron portcullis and suddenly revealed is a magnificent Italianate parterre. First laid out in the early 17th-century and redesigned in the 19th-century, the copper beech trees were planted by Queen Victoria to commemorate her visit in 1842.

Arrive late afternoon at *Gleneagles*.

Overnight at THE GLENEAGLES HOTEL: As the saying goes, “There are many beautiful places in the world. There are many great hotels. There are many famous golf courses and resorts. There is only one *Gleneagles*”. Take time and indulge in the Spa, swim in the pools, reinvigorate ourselves in the Jacuzzi, saunas, Turkish bath or outdoor hot pool.

WED JUN 07 A DAY AT GLENEAGLES

Meals: B, D

Today we may wish to enjoy wonderful leisure facilities at Gleneagles. This is of course the ideal venue to try our hand at using a golf club on one of the **superb golf courses** on the estate, for those who are not quite so adept, take a lesson at the Golf Academy.

We may also wish to try our hand using a fishing rod or gun. There is **fly fishing** available on the lochs on the property. The **clay target shooting** range is one of the finest of its kind in Europe. The **Equestrian School** is a most impressive riding facility – learn the ropes of scurry driving or carriage driving. Visit the **Gun Dog School**, the first school of its kind in the world opened in 2007. Learn how to handle a trained gundog incorporating obedience and agility.

We may also wish to try an unusual driving experience – the **All-Terrain** driving in the **Argos**. These vehicles are all-weather, semi-amphibious, and all-terrain. They are synonymous with the management of Highland estates in Scotland, allowing landowners to reach steep, rocky or swampy areas that are otherwise inaccessible.

For those who have an epicurean palate, why not take an excursion to **The Famous Grouse Experience** at **Glenturret Distillery** in Crieff. Scotland’s oldest working distillery has been making whisky by hand and by heart since 1775. The distillery offers visitors, from novices to enthusiasts, a unique opportunity to experience the traditional handmade distilling processes that have been used to craft the whiskies at Glenturret Distillery for generations. On Our distillery tour, discover how the Glenturret single malt is carefully blended with other grain and malt whiskies to create the UK’s No.1 whisky, The Famous Grouse. We will of course sample the wares before departing!

Overnight at THE GLENEAGLES HOTEL

THU JUN 08 FROM GLENEAGLES TO EDINBURGH

Meals: B, L, D

Leave Gleneagles for a scenic drive over the Ochil Hills and along Glen Devon. Then it is a drive along the highway to the **Forth Road Bridge** that crosses over the river that separates Fife from Edinburgh.

On the far side is **Hopetoun House**, one of the most splendid examples of Georgian architecture in Britain, and often described as the “**Versailles of Scotland**”. Originally built between 1699 and 1707 for the first Earl of Hopetoun, the house is still lived in by the current earl. As we approach the house, the entrance road climbs to suddenly reveal an impressive panoramic view of the main facade. The frontal elevation of the house was cleverly built to create the impression of a larger house. The magnificent interiors boast fine paintings, original furnishings and décor.

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Take lunch at an inn in nearby **South Queensferry**, from where there is a stunning view of the **Forth Rail Bridge** from 1890, the majestic zenith of Victorian construction. From here, take the main road into the centre of Edinburgh and to our final hotel.

Overnight at BALMORAL HOTEL: the stylish and contemporary *Balmoral Hotel* is perhaps the flagship property of the luxury Rocco Forte Collection. While many Edinburgh hotels claim to have Edinburgh's landmarks on their doorstep, few can say their doorstep is a landmark. This will be our home for two evenings. The hotel has two restaurants including the Michelin-starred Number One, and an elegant spa and fitness facility.

Late this afternoon, drive down to the port of Leith. Here the former **Royal Yacht Britannia** is permanently moored. On our private tour, see the staterooms where the Queen entertained overseas dignitaries; and the private rooms where the Royal Family lived and relaxed. The areas where the crew worked behind the scenes are also available to be toured.

It is only a short distance from here to the historic **Vaults** of the **Scotch Malt Whisky Society**, where barrels wines and spirits were historically stored during the port's heyday as a beverage handler. This evening we will have a group dinner in one of the private rooms – finished of course with a dram of one of the finer bottles that the society has to offer!

FRI JUN 09 EDINBURGH – SCOTLAND'S CAPITAL CITY

Meals: B, D

This morning our guide will take us to visit **Edinburgh's Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site**. Take a trip up to the Castle, sitting high above the city on its volcanic rock with highlights starting as soon as we step on the Esplanade. This symbol of Scottish nationhood is home to the 'Honours of Scotland' – the Scottish Crown Jewels.

See the narrow closes and cobbled streets as we continue down the **Royal Mile**, arguably one of the most famous streets in the world. See the impressive crown-shaped spire of **St. Giles Cathedral**, one of the most iconic symbols of the city. Visit the small Thistle Chapel, home of Scotland's ancient order of chivalry.

On our way back to the hotel, we will drive down to the foot of the Royal Mile and see the **Palace of Holyroodhouse**, HM the Queen's official residence when in Scotland. This baroque masterpiece sits opposite the much newer **Scottish Parliament Building** that has been designed in a striking contemporary style.

Lunch today is at leisure; we have the afternoon to browse around the stores of Princes Street, George Street or St Andrew Square.

Early this evening, we will drive a short distance south of the city to **Rosslyn Chapel**. Built between 1446 and 1484, it has been described as an "**Architectural Wonder**" and a "**Library in Stone**", It is a without a doubt a masterpiece of craftsmanship and spooky symbolism. Practically every surface of the chapel is covered with carvings of individual figures and scenes. Myths, legends and of course Hollywood fiction writing have given Rosslyn a unique sense of mystery and wonder. The site became world-famous after its appearance in "**The Da Vinci Code**". The chapel will be open just for us, and illuminated by candles to provide the most evocative and atmospheric of surroundings.

On our way back to the city centre, we will stop at **Prestonfield House**. This country-style hotel is situated at the foot of "**Arthur's Seat**", the volcanic hill that dominates Edinburgh City Centre. Here we will enjoy an excellent dinner as a group in one of the characterful private historically-themed dining rooms.

Overnight at BALMORAL HOTEL

SAT JUN 10 Departure from Edinburgh

We will end our stay with transfers to Edinburgh Airport for our departure flights.






